

Dear Friends,

On Sunday 10th November, as a village, we will gather around the Hightown War Memorial to remember and give thanks for those who have lost their lives in conflicts going back over a century, and at 11am we will fall silent for two minutes. It's important that we remember, with thanks, the names chiselled out on our village memorial. The Kohima Epitaph in Northeast India reads,



'When you go home, tell them of us and say, for your tomorrow we gave our today'.

We will remember them.

At St Stephen's, we continue to pray for peace. We light the 'Peace Candle' and pray the following prayer before all of our services, and include it in our live-stream Compline, each Sunday evening:

> "Most holy God and Father, hear our prayers for all who strive for peace and all who fight for justice. We pray for the leaders of the nations,

that you will guide them in the ways of freedom, justice and truth.

As we commend to you lives lost in terror and conflict,

bring us all, in the end, to the peace of your presence:

through Jesus Christ our Lord, in whose Holy Name we pray. Amen."

We are reminded daily, on our television screens and in our newspapers, of the ongoing and seemingly escalating wars and conflicts in our world.

In my November Focus letter last year, I quoted words from Henri Nouwen, they are just as, if not more relevant this year:

"For Jesus, there are no countries to be conquered, no ideologies to be imposed, no people to be dominated. There are only children, women and men to be loved".

"As peacemakers, we must resist all the powers of war and destruction and proclaim that peace is the divine gift offered to all who affirm life".

Wherever you are on Sunday 10th at 11am, do pause, do fall silent, do remember with gratitude for those who have given their lives and, if you can, offer a prayer for peace in our troubled world. Prayers are always heard. *(cont. p4)*

If you can be with us at the Hightown War Memorial, you will be most welcome to join us in church afterwards for our Remembrance Day Service.

Gift Day Envelopes

With this edition of Focus you will find a 'St Stephen's Gift Day ' envelope. We do hope you will feel able to make a donation, which will assist us to continue our mission to the Hightown Community.

This year we intend to use your gifts towards the cost of essential work on our church roof. We decided it was sensible to have the work done this summer rather than wait and perhaps suffer from a bad winter.

The work cost more than £8,000 and the Liverpool Diocese made a Grant of £3,750 (funded by Church of England) towards this. St Stephen's, though, have had to cover the shortfall.

Many of you may wonder why St Stephen's is asking for your help with this appeal, and holds fund-raising events on a regular basis. In 2023, it cost us £75,000 to run the church and our hall. It may surprise you to hear that each parish is expected to be financially self-sufficient, and that we do not receive regular funding from The Church of England, Sefton Council or Hightown Parish Council towards these running costs.

Any gift, large or small, would be much appreciated and will be faithfully applied. If you are a taxpayer, then completion of the Gift Aid declaration will increase your gift by 25% without any cost to you.

Envelopes, containing your gifts, can be left in the church letter box, (to the right of the church doors), or at The Village Stores.

On behalf of the whole of the St Stephen's community, thank you so much for your generosity.



FROM BETH'S KITCHEN

MINCEMEAT AND MINCE PIES

I am writing this at the end of September when one dare not mention the "C" word. However, this recipe will appear in November when everywhere is thrusting the up-and- coming season at us. Be prepared is my motto, and so with a few moments



to spare one can make one's own mince pies filled with this delicious concoction. Freeze them and you will receive a lot of "Brownie" points when you produce them for a Christmas afternoon tea.

For the mincemeat

225g (1 large) Bramley apple, peeled, cored and finely diced

110g suet (can be vegetarian)	110g currants
175g mixed peel	110g dark brown or muscovado sugar
1 tsp sweet mixed spice	pinch of nutmeg, freshly grated
zest and juice of 1 lemon	zest and juice of 1 orange

2 tablespoons Cognac

To make the mincemeat: In a large bowl, mix all the ingredients together and stir well. Store in an airtight container in the fridge for 4 days before using. It can be kept in the fridge for up to a month.

Make sweet shortcrust pastry with 250g plain flour. Roll out and cut into 24-30 and smaller tops. Line the tartlet moulds and fill with mincemeat to level with the sides, add tops and brush with beaten egg. I scatter mine with caster sugar before putting them in the oven at 170C/gas 5 for about 25 minutes. Cool on a wire rack and then freeze.

Defrost and reheat before serving. Enjoy!

Remembrance 1944: D-Day - the Normandy Landings

"During the night and the early hours of this morning, the first of a series of landings in force upon the European Continent has taken place." Winston Churchill, House of Commons, 6 June, 1944 Stormy Seas

On 6 June, the nation commemorated the 80th anniversary of the 1944 Allied landings in Normandy; they heralded the beginning of the end of the Second World War. Operation Overlord was later known as D-Day because in military parlance D-Day is the starting date of a major operation. For us today, D-Day stands alone as meaning 6 June 1944 - a turning point in history. The D-Day landings represented the greatest recorded seaborne invasion ever, involving 6,800 vessels, 11,500 aircraft, 4,000 ten-tonne landing craft and 156,000 troops. They were an outstanding multi-national Allied achievement and a triumph of organisation and logistics, brilliantly carried out in conditions of the utmost secrecy to maintain the vital element of surprise. Everything, though, depended on the weather in the English Channel, which had defeated many previous invasions. Storms in the Channel had forced William the Conqueror to postpone his invasion of Britain from July to September 1066; storms had destroyed and scattered the Spanish Armada in 1588.


General Eisenhower, the American Supreme Commander of Allied Forces, had fixed Monday, 5 June 1944 for the Normandy invasion, but his chief meteorologist, Scottish Group Captain James Stagg, was uneasy. Reports from weather stations around the British Isles on 3 June did not match the Allied need for calm seas, light winds, good visibility, bright moonlight and low tides for the invasion. Rather, they indicated the approach of a deep North Atlantic depression, leading to storms in the Channel on 4 and 5 June. But reports from Ireland's westernmost weather station on the evening of 4 June signalled an improvement in Channel weather for 6 June. Stagg recommended postponing the invasion one day until 6 June. Any further postponement would have risked the loss of secrecy and lowering of troop morale. Eisenhower reluctantly agreed to the postponement and ordered the invasion for Tuesday 6 June. By the end of D-Day the Allies had established a beachhead and were pushing inland.

The Germans were caught unawares. Their own meteorologists had forecast that Channel storms would continue until mid-June, persuading Field Marshall Erwin Rommel to remain on leave in Germany with his wife's family, rather than taking up command of German coastal defences in Normandy.

A Love Story

One important figure is missing from the weather story of D-Day. Her name was Maureen Sweeney, then Flavin, and her role in the success of D-Day has only recently come to the fore. In 1942, the 19-year-old Irish-born, Maureen Flavin from County Kerry, travelled to Blacksod Point, a village in County Mayo on a remote stretch of the northwest coast of Ireland, to take up the position of postal clerk at the small local post office. The vacancy had been drawn to her attention by Ted Sweeney, the postmistress's son, and lighthouse keeper, with whom Maureen had fallen in love.

Maureen discovered that the post office also served as a weather

station – the westernmost in Europe. She was given the additional task of recording and transmitting

barometric pressures, wind speeds, temperature, precipitation and water vapour to the Irish National Meteorological Service in Dublin. Although the Republic of Ireland was officially neutral in the Second World War, its government did not object to meteorological observations being passed to the Allied Forces. At 1am on 3 June 1944 Maureen noted a rapid drop in barometric pressure and Force 6 winds heading towards the European Continent, indicating stormy weather in the Channel. At 11am on 4 June she re-checked the readings; they remained the same. She was instructed to re-check every hour. Early reports indicated that 5 June would be stormy; but later that 6 June would be just good enough for the invasion. Her reports were sent to James Stagg, who advised Eisenhower to invade on 6 June.

Maureen married Ted Sweeney in 1946. After a long and happy marriage, Ted died in 2001. Maureen died on 17 December 2023, aged 100, leaving a daughter and three sons. The Times published a full obituary on 13 January 2024.

James Stagg has recently been honoured by the British Meteorological Office for his part in D-Day, with the inclusion of his name in the official list of future storm names. So, look out for Storm James and remember the meteorologist and Maureen, the conscientious Irish postal clerk who both helped save D-Day from disaster.

The Roll of Honour on the British Normandy Memorial at Ver-sur-Mer, Calvados, records the names of 22,442 people from more than thirty countries under British Command who were killed in Normandy between 6 June and 31 August 1944.

We salute the few still living, some over 100 years old, who fought in the battle for Normandy; we remember those who lost their lives in the battle for freedom
