

We have been blessed with warm, sunny weather all throughout the spring which has given me the opportunity to sit in my garden and observe the abundant, active and sometimes noisy wildlife. At one point this year, the great spotted woodpecker in the

garden was awakening us at daybreak with his drumming.

This clement weather, and the weather for June, July and August, will be crucial to the success or failure of all attempts to breed and multiply. So the wildlife, our gardens and the local farmers are all hoping for a good season; not too wet but not too dry either, with just enough rain, and plenty of warm sunshine. This will ripen the crops, let plants and animals thrive and allow us to continue to sit in our gardens or stroll along the beach or country lanes and enjoy the great British summer to the full.

As I write, I am observing a female blackbird, (females have brown feathers and a brown bill), a most industrious and attentive worker, who, over the last few days, has been collecting box moth caterpillars, which have been feasting upon the box hedge in my garden. Initially, I was not overjoyed to find box moth eggs, however, earlier on in the year, I decided against using pesticides. Watching the blackbird, the grey tits and the other garden birds collecting the box moth caterpillars, to feed themselves and their young, has been a source of great joy, not only for me but I'm sure the box hedge is appreciating the symbiotic relationship too.

We only need to spend a short, quiet time surrounded by nature before we realise the Divine Presence that is in all of God's good creation.

We will have also re-elected our Church Warden, Judith Welch and elected and welcomed our second Church Warden in Jane Copeland, which is truly wonderful. We are most grateful to Jane to responding to God's call to serve our parish in this way. We have a great team of officers and a very supportive PCC. God is good!

A real encouragement for me, over these last two years, has been the growth of our different congregations. Sunday morning, our All-Age Eucharist, Wednesday morning, Toddler Church and Sanctuary at Seven congregations have all seen growth, some of it small, but that's okay. Our Sunday evening BCP congregation has remained fairly static with regards to numbers, although we do welcome visitors from time to time. Together, we share in so many ways.

Relationships and sharing together are important and one way we do this is with our 'after service fellowship'. We have a good number of folks who stay for a cuppa and a chat after Sunday and Wednesday morning services. Our monthly coffee mornings also provide that space to gather and share together. It's good to meet and share together.

In June, we celebrate several important feasts in the Church....

Pentecost: when we give thanks for the sharing of the Holy Spirit on the disciples... a rushing mighty wind filled the place where they were meeting. Tongues of fire appeared and rested over them and the Spirit enabled them to speak in different tongues so sharing the message of Jesus.

Trinity Sunday: where we celebrate the doctrine of the Trinity, the three persons of God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, a blessing to us all.

Corpus Christi: Thursday 19th, sixty days after Easter, the Thursday after Trinity Sunday, we give thanks for the Eucharist, for Holy Communion. We will hold a special service at church on this evening. The Latin words 'Corpus Christi' translate to the 'Body of Christ'. At every Eucharist, we share the Body and Blood of Christ, as Jesus instructed, 'Do this in remembrance of me'.

On the 25th of this month I will have been with you for two years! Where has that time gone?? I am grateful to God for calling me to serve here in Hightown. Sharing together, we have achieved much in that time.... But there is still much more that we would like to do!! Do come and join us at any of our services; come and share with us. A Statement Following The Death Of Pope Francis by The Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell

Here are some excerpts from that statement:

'Let us walk together, work together, pray together.' These are the words Pope Francis said to me when we met in 2023. They sum up his vision for the church, both the Roman Catholic Church but also ecumenically.

"Francis's whole life and ministry was centred on Jesus who comes among us, not to be served, but to serve. We saw that in Francis's service of the poor, his love of neighbour especially the displaced, migrant, the asylum seeker, his deep compassion for the well-being of the earth and his desire to build the church in new ways. Francis showed us how to follow Jesus, and encouraged us to go and do

"His encyclicals and teachings were supported by his deeds and actions. His whole life was instantly recognisable as those of one who followed Jesus.

"Pope Francis was acutely aware of the divisions between our churches, and I remember the powerful work he did with the then Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, and the Moderator of the Church of Scotland in promoting peacebuilding in South Sudan.

"I remember, in the brief times I spent with him, how this holy man of God was also witty, lively, good to be with, and the warmth of his personality and interest in others shone out from him. May he rest in peace and rise in glory.

The Fruits of The Holy Spirit

"So by their fruits you will know them" (Matthew 7:20)

The entire passage in Mattew's Gospel helps us to understand the Fruits of the Holy Spirit, which are the observable behaviours of people who have allowed the grace of the Holy Spirit to be effective in them. These qualities reflect God's nature, who cultivates them within us as part of His work of restoring all of creation.

Man and Horse By Graham Goodchild

In memory of Janice 1st February 1960 - 11th April 2025

The late Janice Mullings, of Larkhill Grove, once kindly forwarded a photograph of her grandfather, Thomas Benoni Mullings, astride his horse. Thomas served in the East Anglian Brigade, Royal Field Artillery during the First World War following service in the 1st Surrey Rifles. Thankfully, he



survived the War, but sadly his two brothers Alfred and Albert Mullings, lost their lives serving in the Royal Navy. Six of Janice's great uncles also served in the First World War. Five were brothers the sixth served as a Major in the Indian Army.

Men like Thomas, in charge of horses in the First World War, shared a common anguish at their suffering. As a soldier in the Royal Field Artillery he would have witnessed the misery that horses had to endure in the hellish conditions of the Western Front, pulling supply and ammunition wagons, field artillery guns and ambulances. These men loved and respected their animals. It was not unusual to find injured horses bandaged with men's own emergency dressings. Some would give or risk their lives out of love for their horses. One officer recalled a situation in May 1918 when, withdrawing his troop under heavy machine gun fire, a horse was shot from under its rider. The officer ordered the trooper to leave the dying horse and mount behind him, but the trooper refused. Risking death, he crawled towards the horse, which raised his head in recognition. The officer repeated the order, offering to shoot the animal, but the trooper merely shook his head. He stayed the next few moments with his horse, stroking its head and neck until it died. He then re-joined the troop. The pastoral duties of Army chaplains extended to arranging mercy killings for badly injured horses and providing comfort to soldiers who had lost much-loved animals.

It was impossible to shelter horses from machine gun and rifle fire, but on the East African Front between British Kenya and German Tanganyika an ingenious solution was found by Major Robert Stordy, chief veterinary officer, to protect British grey horses from German snipers. Using a silver nitrate solution, he painted the Army greys with zebra stripes and leopard spots to camouflage

them and confuse the enemy. His success was rewarded with a DSO. But sadly, the East African campaign saw the greatest number of horses, mules and donkeys killed in the First World War.

The bond between man and horse was deep as captured in the following verse penned by Private William Parr, Field Artillery, 1st Canadian Division:


'And when the grand, great, final roll call comes,
To be the first upon parade we'll try
Oh Lord of All, please grant my only prayer,
To take my horses with me when I die.'

Janice's Mother, Olga, remembered the death of Thomas Benoni Mullings on 1 April 1977. The fate of his horse is unknown. We hope that it enjoyed a well-earned retirement.

Janice Louise Mullings, who died on 11th April 2025.

May she rest in peace and rise in glory.





A Good Read-The Truant School

This school was said to have been built with bricks from the old Walton Gaol, I can still remember when we first came to Hightown, about 1911, what a forbidding place it appeared. The gates were bolted and barred and a huge St Bernard dog was to be see patrolling the grounds. A watchman was on duty all day occupying a sentry hut inside the entrance gate. Strict discipline was enforced in those days. Mrs Watson, who with her husband, was in charge of the school as headmaster and matron, for some years, told me that heavy weights (used as doorstops in her day) had been used many years ago as a punishment, to be carried by the wrongdoers - shades of Jane Eyre! There were also cells - the doors having peep holes. There was a large staff as the boys at the school had to learn a trade. The Church of England and Roman Catholic children had their separate teaching staff and lived apart.

The boys had to attend church services each Sunday - the C of E boys at Altcar Church and the RC boys at Little Crosby. They set off to walk the distances like regiments of young soldiers in hail, rain or sunshine each week, attired in corduroy suits, Eton collars, Glengarry hats and in wet weather, black oilskin capes. Mr T Tiffin used to

read and talk to the boys on a Sunday afternoon - a kind action which I am sure was very much appreciated. He was a great favourite with the boys.

A rather interesting story was told to me last year. One of our residents, Mrs D Savin, was passing the site of the old school when two elderly men stopped her and asked what happened to the school. She explained to them that it had been demolished and to her surprise they said that they had been pupils at the school, "old boys"- emigrated who had prospered. Whilst they were in England they thought they would revisit their old school, just to see if any of the teaching staff were still there. They said that the discipline had been strict but nevertheless they had benefited from it.

During WW2 children from Liverpool were evacuated to the Truant School (the remand home boys having been removed by this time.) The ladies of the village took turns to bath the children and put them to bed.


