By cutting strategically placed holes in plastic containers and bottles, they have created a way of protecting their young plants from a late frost or little nibblers, without any expense to themselves.

#### **Don't Step on a Bee Day – 10th July**

Have you ever wanted to step on a bee? Hopefully most of us haven't – but the eye-catching name of this annual event aims to remind people of how important bees are in our ecosystem, and of the need to promote their protection.



Don't Step on a Bee Day highlights the crucial role bees play in pollination, and also that their populations are declining, because of habitat loss, pesticides, and climate change.

If you want to help the bees, here is what you can do:

**Plant Bee-Friendly Flowers**: Grow a variety of flowers in your garden that attract and support bees, such as lavender, sunflowers, and marigolds.

Avoid Using Pesticides: Reduce or eliminate these in your garden, to create a safer environment for bees.

**Support Local Beekeepers**: Purchase honey from local beekeepers, to help support sustainable beekeeping practices.

**Create a Bee Bath**: Place a shallow dish of water with stones in your garden to provide bees with a safe place to drink.

**Educate Others**: Share information about the importance of bees and how you protect them with friends, family, and on social media.





### MUSHROOM SOUP

Here is another recipe from FOCUS ON FOOD. It is the first in the book and the one I use most often. It was given to Elizabeth Richardson when she was having afternoon tea with the Mayor and Mayoress of Sefton at a past



#### **INGREDIENTS:**

50g butter	1 medium onion, finely chopped
25g green pepper,	Salt and Pepper
finely chopped (optional)	500ml chicken or vegetable stock
250g mushrooms, chopped	Parsley
2 dessertspoons plain flour	250 ml milk

#### **METHOD:**

Melt butter in a heavy based frying pan and fry onions and pepper (if using) until just soft, not brown. Add mushrooms, salt and pepper, cover and cook over a low heat for about 10 minutes, being careful not to burn.

Stir in flour, add stock and bring to the boil. Simmer for 5 minutes, add milk cool and liquidise.

Reheat, stir and serve, scattered with the chopped parsley.

Serves 4 with good crusty bread.



# A Good Read by Colette Hudson

#### based on the book, 'At Random', by Miss C Scott

**The Church Hut:** This was an old army hut, erected by the church as a temporary measure, until funds were available to build a proper hall. Concerts, sales of work etc. were held in the hut.

Mr S Farmer had written several plays, two of which were performed at the church hut, one entitled 'The Verdict', one 'The Picture'. The play, 'The Verdict' was broadcast on the BBC North Regional Programme on March 11th 1932.

The St Stephen's drama section of the youth club, presented a play entitled 'A Day In The Life Of Colonel St George', during the festival of Britain. This play was written by the late Mr S M Farmer. Mrs G Clayton painted the scenery for these plays.

Later, plays were produced by the Misses Cannell and the late Miss M Nicholl. These were performed on two nights and the hut was filled to capacity. The now St Stephen's Hall, as we know it today, was purchased with money left to the church by the late Miss Barton. We owe her a debt of gratitude.

(Editor's Note; When I was a child, the Misses Cannell lived together in the first house on the right hand side, as you go down Thornbeck Avenue. They looked very alike and I always supposed them to be twins. They always had perfectly coiffured blonde hair, rolled under at the ends; likewise, they always dressed immaculately. As far as I was aware, the sisters never went out to work, and were probably ladies of their own means.)

**The Hightown Flower Show:** These shows were held in the army hut, known as the church hut, when the number of entries were few and in the Truant School as the number of entries increased and more space was required. Mr and Mrs Watson, (headmaster and matron), gave us help in every way - not to mention the use of the kitchen for teas!




