In memory of Graham Goodchild

"A what?" asked I, when our vicar, Revd. Keith Thornborough, responded to my request for suggestions for a gift to St Stephen's, in memory of my late husband, Graham.

"An aumbry," was what he had said. Keith patiently described the purpose and importance of an aumbry. He explained why it was needed and why it was particularly appropriate for Graham's memory.

An aumbry is a box or cupboard kept near to the altar used for the reservation of bread and wine that has been consecrated for future use, especially for the sick. Until now, this has been kept on the side in the Sacristy.

Keith arranged a visit to Ormsby's, church suppliers, in Southport to find an aumbry. There I beheld a fascinating array of church memorabilia: a veritable treasure trove including vestments, statues, candles, pedestals, sanctuary lamps and crucifixes. Bruno, the director of the business, knew the whereabouts of every item – including aumbries

and tabernacles in various shapes, sizes and materials – carved wood or metal. Some were designed to fit into a wall like a safe; some had an inner door with a lunette for devotion. Ours, with just a front door, was to sit on the credence table at the altar and to complement our other sanctuary furnishings.



I had measured the area, but unnecessarily; Keith quickly recognised "our" aumbry - the right size, neither too plain nor too ornate. And as lacquered brass, it will not cause our valiant brass cleaners any grief, needing only occasional dusting. Bruno told us that it had previously been housed in a chapel, now closed, of a religious order in the northwest of England. It was about forty years old, and the order had passed it to Ormsby's to ensure

that it reached a suitable environment.

When Keith placed the aumbry on our credence table it looked immediately at home – as though it had always been there. Hazel, who as our sacristan, looks after the bread and wine, among her other responsibilities, was delighted. If you would like to view our aumbry in its place,

join us at a service at St Stephen's and ask Revd Keith to show you.







From Beth's Kitchen

BEETROOT SOUP

(or Bortsch, as it is known in Eastern Europe.)

This is a delicious, thick intensely coloured soup, which can be served hot in Winter or cold in Summe. I have eaten it with a portion of cooked butter beans to give added protein. For a vegetarian version use vegetable stock as I do.



Ingredients

50g butter250g

raw beetroot, peeled and roughly chopped

1 onion, chopped

1.5 litre beef stock

Soured cream and a handful of chopped chives to garnish

Salt and pepper to taste

1 carrot, chopped

1 tbsp caster sugar

3 garlic cloves, chopped

Juice of ½ lemon

Method

Melt the butter in a large pan and, over a gentle heat, slowly sweat the beetroot, onion, carrot and garlic, turning the vegetables over in the butter.

Add the sugar and the stock, season with pepper and simmer for 40 minutes until the vegetables are tender.

Blend the soup, add the lemon juice and salt to taste. Serve in individual bowls with a swirl of soured cream and a scattering of chives.

Eco Church-For The Love Of God's Good Creation

Did you spot many butterflies this past summer?

The wildlife charity Butterfly Conservation is deeply worried about our butterflies. Or rather, the lack of them. It seems that more than 80 per cent of our species have declined sharply in number since 1970s.



Each summer sees the Big Butterfly Count, when the public is encouraged to send in the number of butterflies they have seen over



a short period of time. Last year saw the lowest number of butterflies spotted in the count's 14-year history. Even the familiar species like the small white, common blue and small tortoiseshell had their worst summer ever. And a record number of people saw no

butterflies at all.

Butterflies have been hit by climate change, the use of pesticides, and damage to their habitats. The drought this summer will have been bad news for their caterpillar offspring, which need growing plants to feed on.

So, this autumn, why not plan a happier year for butterflies in 2026? As you prepare your garden for winter, go to


