Editor's Note

What do you do at 9pm every Sunday night? If, like me, you go online to join Reverend Keith in his regular Sunday night prayers, you will recognise the words written on the front of the magazine this month. They are taken from Psalm

104 and poetically summarize God's creation, as found in the first chapter of Genesis. The words give us an exuberant and masterful survey of God's good earth. Attributed by scholars to King David, it focuses on the Spirit's work in creating the world and in sustaining it, even though it is now fallen. Before redemption was necessary, and as redemption is still ongoing, the Spirit of God was active and remains active in creation.

When I hear Reverend Keith reading these words on a Sunday evening I feel elated, because not only can we see the beauty around us, but we are part of that beauty, and the beauty witnesses to the glory of God. I recall Louis Armstrong's gravelly voice singing the iconic 'What a Wonderful World'. But there's a huge difference between that more modern song and this ancient song. Armstrong stops with the world's beauty, while the psalm is designed to sing about God's role in that beauty. It is a hymn of praise to the God who created nature and beauty and the psalmist's use of the word 'wisdom' suggests that he believes there is a mind behind this creation.

Why not read the psalm for yourself?

The Parish Giving Scheme

Extract Taken from the Liverpool Diocesan website

We are lucky to have a treasurer who saw the benefits of the PGS and introduced it to our church. Membership has fluctuated, as people have joined and left our congregation, and currently we have twenty two members. We are a small church but we are growing in number again and will be



introducing our new friends to the PGS in due course.

At first, some of the congregation were not happy, as they liked to put their envelope on the plate. But we overcame that by providing a couple of tokens to each giver and, as a back-up, having some spares on a table to be picked up as you came into church.

During Covid and lockdown it was such a benefit to the church, as giving income kept coming in via the scheme, and helped greatly with church finances Without PGS we would have really struggled.

Now that banks and post offices are closing, (we have neither in our village), it is more difficult to obtain cash which is another reason to encourage the PGS.

We still do not 'pass the plate', but it is on a table and taken to the altar with the bread and wine. In this way, givers can still put their token on the plate. Recently, our vicar has started giving thanks for gifts given via the PGS and the card machine. So, however the congregation gives, it is acknowledged in prayer.

This is the experience of one member of our congregation:

"I originally gave to St Stephens via Gift Aid envelope scheme.

Whilst this was okay it often meant I was scrambling around on Sunday mornings looking for cash to put into the envelope, and occasionally I had to put in a cheque. Also, if I missed church, I didn't always 'double up' to cover my absences.

Originally, the only way to join the scheme was by completing and sending off a paper form. Nowadays, however, one short and simple telephone call to the helpful people at PGS is all you need to join, revise your gifts or even make a one-off gift. You can also do this via their website. I have taken advantage of these arrangements and would recommend the scheme as the most efficient way to donate to your church."

Our Gift Aid Secretary works closely with the Treasurer, and is aware of the benefits of the PGS to the church, both financially and in terms of the reduction in administration time. The reduction in cost of purchasing the envelopes is a secondary financial benefit to the church.

A Taste Of The Good Old Days

Many villagers enjoyed a Sunday afternoon in St Stephen's Hall, tucking into a delicious afternoon tea, including home made cakes. Songs were sung with great gusto, lead by Reverend Keith and a happy time was had by all.





A Good Read by Colette Hudson

Continuing our exploration of Hightown in times past

Blundell Road, Horses and Eggs



Prior to the 1914/18 war, according to Miss Scott, the houses in Blundell Road, beyond Blundell Avenue, were built before the road was completed. People moving into the houses there had their furniture man handled along the road through the

sand. Mrs Berry, who then lived at Frith's Farm, told this interesting story to Miss Scott about this:

Before the roads were built on the shore side of the railway line, horse-drawn pantechnicon (furniture removal vans) came out to Hightown as far as the railway crossing. These horses, from the town, were not used to treading on sand, stopped at the farm, (which was then situated at the rear of Our Lady of Victories Church Presbytery), where they were exchanged for farm horses to complete the journey.



At a later date, when I was a child, Mrs Berry, lived at Hamgate Farm (1st farm on the left as you leave Hightown). She was quite a feisty, elderly lady, who was living with her two spinster daughters. They kept hens and we would be frequently sent for eggs. It was a 'collect your own' affair from the haybales in the barn. You had to keep your fingers crossed that their fearsome sheep dog was not on patrol at that time, or you may not have had fingers to cross the next time you went! Her two daughters delivered milk to the houses in Hightown on a daily basis. When I was about twelve years old, I used to help them deliver on a Saturday morning. This was great fun, as it involved standing on the back step of their van and hanging onto the back doors as the van travelled from one group of houses to the next. I would jump on and off to place the bottles of milk on the doorsteps. It was the highlight of my week! The Berry girls, as they were always known as, even into their dotage, lived out their years in a house at the top of St George's Road.
